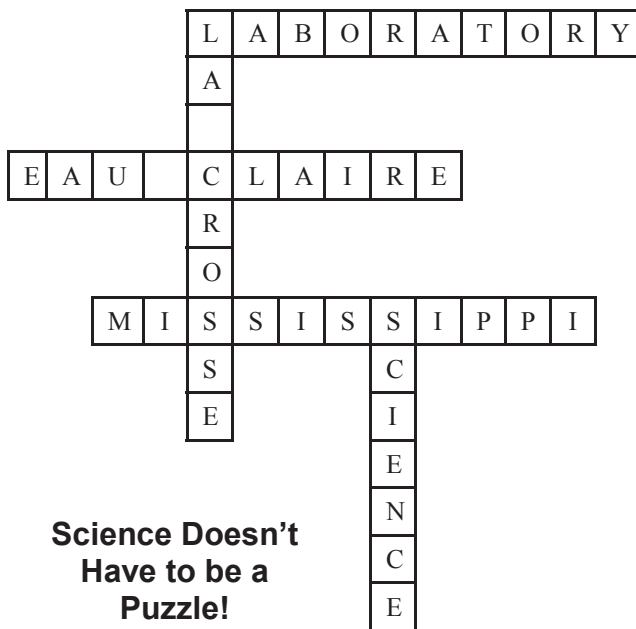

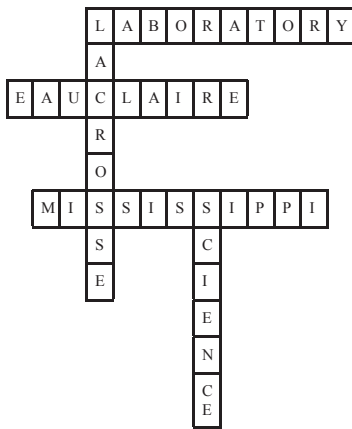

Dr. Schraith is a practicing pathologist and Department Chair of Pathology and Laboratory Medicine at Gundersen Lutheran Medical Center in La Crosse, Wisconsin. He is a Wisconsin native and alumnus of the University of Wisconsin-Madison (BS and MD).



After completing his residency (Anatomic and Clinical Pathology) and fellowship (Surgical Pathology) at the University of Iowa, he returned to the Badger State eight years ago. Dr. Schraith was honored to receive the Thomas C. Stenger D.D.S. "Teacher of the Year" Award by the Gundersen Lutheran Oral and Maxillofacial Surgery Residency Program in 2006-07.

He currently serves on a number of committees and multidisciplinary tumor boards at Gundersen Lutheran.
